1. During activities on the water, using canoes, personal flotation devices will be worn at all times and fastened correctly.
2. Other activities on the water (e.g. swimming) will be done in a designated and supervised area only.
3. All orders given pertaining to safety will be complied with immediately.

Waiver of Liability Agreement

I hereby release and forever discharge Plast Ukrainian Youth Association of Canada (under whose jurisdiction Zolota Bulava camp is being held), its directors, officers, agents, servants, other participants and employees and its or their successors, heirs, and assigns (the "Releasees") should any injury or loss of limb or life happen to my person / to my child whilst partaking in Zolota Bulava camp. I also waive claim against the "Releasees" should any damage or loss occur against my personal property / property of my child whilst partaking in Zolota Bulava camp and any loss of any nature caused by delays resulting from inclement weather or other natural conditions during camp duration and/or participation of the undersigned / my child in Zolota Bulava camp and notwithstanding that the same may have been contributed to or occasioned by the negligence of the "Releasees" or any of them.

Governing Law and Jurisdiction Agreement

Governing Law

The patient agrees that the relationship between himself or herself and the health care practitioner providing medical or other health care and treatment shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the province of Ontario.

Jurisdiction

The patient acknowledges that the treatment/service is to be performed in the province of Ontario, and agrees that the courts of the province of Ontario shall have exclusive jurisdiction to adjudicate any complaint, demand, claim or cause of action, whether based on alleged breach of contract or alleged negligence arising out of the treatment.

The patient hereby agrees that he or she will commence any such legal proceedings in the province of Ontario and only in the province of Ontario and hereby submits to the jurisdiction of that province.

MEDICAL PRIVACY FORM

Purpose of this Policy

The Privacy Act protects Canadians from misuse of information. Privacy of personal information is governed by the Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act (PIPEDA). Plast, Zolota Bulava recognizes a participant's right under the Privacy Act. The collection of personal medical information is limited to details needed to provide emergency medical care. This shall include all of the personal information provided in sections I to VIII inclusive as found in the medical questionnaire.

Accountability

A Privacy Officer will be appointed and will be responsible for the monitoring information, collection and data security.

Personal Information

Personal information is information about an identifiable individual. Personal information includes information that relates to their personal characteristics (e.g. gender, age, height, weight, home address or phone number) and their health (e.g. health history, health conditions, health services received by them). **Plast, Zolota Bulava retain these records from the time they are received to the end of the camp, unless in the case of the participant, treatment was rendered as a result of a medical emergency, or where a third party investigation is required, and/or legal action is contemplated, at which time the information will be treated as a medical record and retained as defined in Ontario Regulation 114/94, made under the Medicine Act, 1991.**

Purpose

Plast Zolota Bulava retains medical information critical to the wellness of the participant in order to provide critical information to medical person (s) in case of an emergency or injury. This can include but is not limited to insurance number or policy, list of allergies, medical alerts, injury records and required contact names in cases of an emergency.

ПРАВИЛЬНИК ПОВЕДІНКИ

Відноситься до всіх хто є на терені табору в Канаді.

1. Учасник/ця табору виконує накази і доручення таборового проводу та булави.
2. Таборовики придержуються всіх точок пластового закону як також державного і провінційного закону.
3. Всі беруть активну участь у всіх таборових зайняттях (хіба є перед тим зголошена причина).
4. Таборовики користуються розговірною українською мовою в мірі своїх можливостей.
5. Поважаємо гідність людини у поведінці між собою та іншими і розуміємо, що всі вияви знущання є заборонені:
Пряме знущання:
 - Фізичне (побиття, штовхання, і.т.п.)
 - Усне (кепкування, приниження, образливі вислови)Непряме знущання:
 - Соціальне (поширення чуток, прилюдно соромити когось, навмисно невиключати когось або ігнорувати їх)
 - Кібер (електронна технологія--мобільні телефони, текстові повідомлення, фото)
6. Таборовики не виходять поза визначені межі табору або зайняття без дозволу виховника або члена проводу табору.
7. Таборовики скрізь придержуються правил особистої безпеки і правил, які будуть визначені на поодинокі зайняття.
8. Палення вогнів недозволено поза місцями, що для цього призначені.
9. Під час водних зайнять (окрім плавання) обов'язує рятувничий пояс.
10. Водні зайняття можуть відбуватися тільки у призначений на це час і під наглядом виховника.
11. Таборовики придержуються правил безслідного таборування.
12. Таборовики не переховують у шатрі/бараку будь-яких харчів, косметики чи інших речей, яких запах принадує диких звірят.
13. Не порушуємо приватної власності інших і передаємо всі знайдені речі булаві.
14. Шануємо таборовий інвентар і вживаємо його за дозволом булави.
15. Алькогольні напитки, тютюн, чи інші наркотики не мають місця на пластовому таборі і є строго заборонені.
16. На табір недозволено вживати радіоприймачів, „iPods“, або мобільнок хіба за окремим дозволом проводу табору.
17. Ці правила стосуються до тих юнаків/юначок які вже закінчили 18 років до часу табору.
18. У випадку порушення державного або пластового закону, правил безпеки або таборових правил, провід табору може усунути таборовика з табору (у випадку новацтва/юнацтва повідомляючи про це батьків) без повернення оплати і висилки дитини додому на кошт батьків.
19. Список поданих правил не є цілковитим, і провід застерігає собі право додати правила.

RULES OF CONDUCT

Applies to all youth, counsellors, volunteers and members of the Leadership Team.

1. All campers follow the directives of camp staff.
2. Campers are to abide by the Plast Oath and Scout Law as well as federal and provincial laws.
3. Campers actively participate in all camp activities (unless exempt for a previously reported reason).
4. Campers are to speak Ukrainian to the best of their abilities.
5. Campers respect others and treat everyone with courtesy and respect and understand that bullying of any sort is not tolerated.
Direct bullying:
 - Physical (hitting, shoving, kicking, etc.)
 - Verbal (taunting, degrading comments, put-downs, slurs, name calling)Indirect bullying:
 - Social (spreading rumours, public embarrassment, intentionally leaving someone out of activities/conversations)
 - Cyber (using any form of electronic technology – cell phones, computers, texts, videos, photos, social media sites to taunt, embarrass, threaten)
6. Campers are to stay in the designated camp and/or activity area. They are not permitted to go beyond these areas with the authorization of a counsellor or a member of the camp leadership team.
7. Campers must obey personal safety rules and regulations to be determined and explained at each and every activity.
8. Camp fires are permitted only in designated areas.
9. A life jacket must be worn when participating in activities on the water, except swimming.
10. Water activities will be at set times and will only be under the supervision of a counsellor.
11. Campers will camp using “Leave no trace” principles.
12. Campers will not store in their tent or cabin any food, cosmetics, or other items whose scent may entice wild animals.
13. Campers will respect other’s property and not steal or borrow other people’s possessions without their consent. Any found items will be turned in to camp staff.
14. Campers will respect camp property and equipment and will use it with the permission of camp staff.
15. Alcoholic drinks, tobacco, or other drugs have no place in Plast camps and are strictly prohibited.
16. Campers are not allowed to use radios, “iPods”, or cell phones, except with special authorization by the camp leadership team.
17. All youth registering for a Plast Camp must adhere to these rules, including those who may have reached 18 years of age prior to the camp commencing.
18. In the case of violation of any Canadian laws or of the Plast safety or camp rules, the camp director can expel the camper from the camp (after notifying the parents), and send the camper home at the parents’ cost.
19. This list of rules is not necessarily complete; other rules may be added as deemed necessary by the camp leaders.
